

Good Practice Competition Terms and Conditions

AIM OF THE COMPETITION

To identify local good practices within schools, media, SME's, large enterprises, public sector organizations, NGO's and civil society. These good practices shall be disseminated through the Voice for All website and documents produced throughout the campaign's duration.

COMPETITION REGULATIONS

Article 1: Competition theme

The National Commission for the Promotion of Equality through the programme PROGRESS is organizing a good practice competition entitled on initiatives taken to eliminate discrimination and efforts made to improve the quality of life.

Article 2: Who can take part?

- All schools and educational institutions in Malta and Gozo
- Educators, teachers
- Members of the media
- Public sector personnel
- Small, medium, large business executive
- NGO's
- Civil Society



Article 3: How to enter?

Candidates are required to visit the NCPE website, fill in the registration form and send it on line by **no later than 12th November 2008**.

Candidates are to deliver the good practice together with a copy of the registration form in person to NCPE, Gattard House, National Road, HMR 9010 **no later than Tuesday 20th November 2008**. Otherwise, if submission cannot be delivered in person, it is strongly recommended that they be sent by mail service and reach NCPE by **Monday 17th November 2008**.

Article 4: What constitutes a good practice?

A good practice is any initiative taken in order to eliminate any form of discrimination on the ground of gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, disability, age and multiple discrimination from occurring or re-occurring.

Article 5: Copyright

The good practices submitted and those short-listed should agree to be published in a good practice document on local initiatives. These good practices can also be used, published and distributed with partner organizations and with the European Community. All submissions shall become the property of NCPE and will not be returned.



Article 6: Awards

One award shall be presented to the winners of each of the following categories:

Category 1: schools/ educational institutions

Category 2: public sector organizations

Category 3: small, medium and large business corporations

Category 4: media

Category 5: NGOs and civil society

Article 7: Selection of winners and awards at national level

The winners will be selected according to the following criteria:

- Rationale of good practice
- Replicability
- Graphic quality
- Clarity of the message
- Originality of the work.

The winners will be invited to attend an awards ceremony held during the final conference on **Thursday 16th December 2008**.



Article 8: Responsibility

Organizers cannot be held responsible for the cancellation, postponement or modification of the competition due to unforeseen circumstances. Furthermore, the dates mentioned in Articles 3 and 7 may be changed due to organizational reasons or unforeseen circumstances. In such cases, the participants shall be advised as soon as possible.

Article 9: Acceptance of the rules

Participation in the competition shall imply full acceptance of these rules.

Article 10: Data protection

For awarding purposes a contact person will be identified for each good practice. This contact person is responsible of liaising with NCPE. The data of such a person will be kept confidential and any sensitive information provided in the good practices will be kept for internal purposes only.
